## ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.)

Since 1923 the tall Gothicized tower of St. George's church has been a major Chicopee Falls landmark. Constructed of red sandstone and brick, this late Gothic Revival Churche's components include (in addition to the tower) a projecting vestibule, long nose with (clerestory), transparent and apse. In general its walls are pieced by pointed arch and quatre foil windows with heavy sandstone moldings. Butt rieses appear at the tower. The main on Belcher St. entrances exhibits three deeply recessed pointed arch openings.

## HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.)

After the Civil War, French Canadians came to Chicopee in great numbers to work in the textile mills and other Chicopee River valley industries. As early as 1871 the first French Catholic parish was organized in Chicopee. By 1885 a Canadian American parish had been established on Academy St. Hill, Front St. on what is now the site of Chicopee High School, known as the Church of the Assumption, it burned in 1912. St. George's parish was originally known as St. Joachim. Organized in 1893, it was originally located in a small chapel on Maple St. During the early 1890's this parish the Greek Revival Pliny Cadwell Hose on East Main St. to serve as a rectory. The first pastor was Alexis Delphos under the leadership of Father Gagnon. The present Gothic Revival building at East Main and Belcher Streets was erected at a cost of \$225,000 - at that time a parochial school and numnary were completed on the property. St. George's was dedicated in 1923. St. George's Church was designed by George H. Fugere of George H. Fugere and Sons, architects and enginners, 112 Main St. Chicopee Falls.
